

THE HORSE ~ NAME, PEDIGREE, SHOW/PERFORMANCE RECORD:

Maestoso II Shama II – “Shama” Modern, classical type stallion approved for breeding by Dr. Jaromir Oulehla. Has unusual and valuable bloodlines through his dam-side, making him an advantageous choice for American Lipizzan breeders. According to Dr. Oulehla, he should be attractive genetically to U.S. Breeders due to his increased genetic diversity on his dam’s side. Bred by White Horse Vale Lipizzans. Sire: Maestoso II Ambrosia, bred by White Horse Vale (442 Maestoso II Primavera, Tempel bred from Piber stock x Ambrosia, White Horse Vale bred from Piber stock) Dam: Shama, bred by Shamrock Hill Farm (Siglavy Dalea, bred by El Capitan Ranch from Budapest and Raflyn breeding x Athena, bred by Bay Cliff farm from Piber and Raflyn breeding). Accomplishments: “Shama” has been shown successfully through Second Level with scores in the high-sixties. He is currently schooling Third and Fourth level dressage, and shows a beautiful affinity for the passage.

PROGENY:

Has only been bred very lightly. 100% first cycle conception rate when bred to non-problematic (reproductively) mares. Our first foal by “Shama” arrived in Spring 2006 and she is the spitting image of her sire. Gorgeous in every way with beautiful neck, back, and topline and absolutely spectacular movement. She has his comedic, personable personality as well.

WARRANTIES, IF ANY:

We guarantee a live, standing, healthy foal: if mare dies, loses pregnancy, or produces a foal that does not survive past 24 hours old, mare owner may have a breedback for following year only. Mare owner may substitute another mare if mare dies or is determined to be reproductively unsound by a equine reproductive specialist veterinarian.

STUD FEE:

Stud Fee is \$1750.

BOOKING FEES, OTHER COSTS TO MARE OWNER:

Mare owners pay \$250 booking fee, veterinarian collection costs and shipping costs. For shipped semen: Mare owner pays collection/shipment fees. The collection fee for shipped semen is \$300.00/shipment. For on-site artificial insemination (done at our farm): The collection fee for on-site artificial insemination is \$200.00/collection.

Mare owner pays all vet fees directly to veterinarian, and Mare Owner's account must be paid in full before mare can leave the farm.

EXCLUSIONS, SUCH AS LOCAL STATE AREAS, BREEDS, TYPES:

Cross-breeding is acceptable.

BREEDING TRACK RECORD:

Quality of each semen collection is checked thoroughly before shipping. Semen shipments have proven to have excellent motility and longevity. Has only been bred very lightly. 100% first cycle conception rate when bred to non-problematic (reproductively) mares.

SHIPPED SEMEN REQUIREMENTS:

48 hours advance notice via telephone. Shipment via FEDEX. For shipped semen, mare owner provides Equitainer or pays \$250.00 Equitainer deposit (required before first shipment will be sent). Mare owner must have veterinarian assistance (please, no guessing as to heat cycle, predicted ovulation).

LIVE COVERS:

Live covers only to cooperative mares. Boarding is \$10.00 per day dry (no foal at side) or \$15.00 per day wet (foal at side). Shoes must be removed, and authorization given for administration of tranquilizer (administered by veterinarian, at mare owner's expense), if necessary. If mare is uncooperative, artificial insemination will be done, mare owner is responsible for related fees (see above).
